V Foundation Funded Researchers – Proven Positive Impact

- **Meenakshi Hegde, M.D., MBBS**, is a 2019 Translational Grantee at the Baylor College of Medicine and Texas Children's Hospital.
- Dr. Hegde's research dives into how immunotherapy can be used to treat children and adolescents with sarcoma, a rare type of cancer that develops in the body's connective tissues (ex: bone, muscle, nerves).
- Dr. Hegde recently published exciting results from her V-funded research which supports a phase 1 clinical trial for high-risk sarcoma patients. Dr. Hegde's novel treatment approach engineers immune cells to effectively find and destroy the cancer by targeting a certain protein in the cancer cells.
- The results of the study were very encouraging. The treatment was safe and of the 13 patients participating in the trial, more than half showed some clinical benefit.
- Overall, this research supports a potential safe, new treatment option for sarcoma patients.
